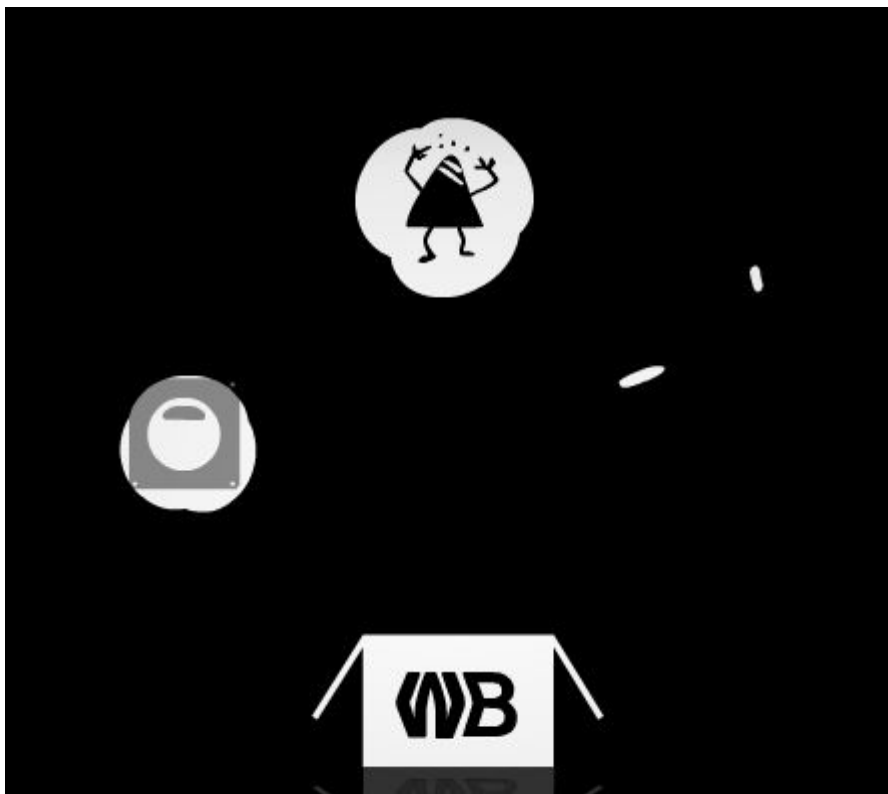


Folio Induction Menu and Website Documentation

In your situation, it is fine. Good luck!

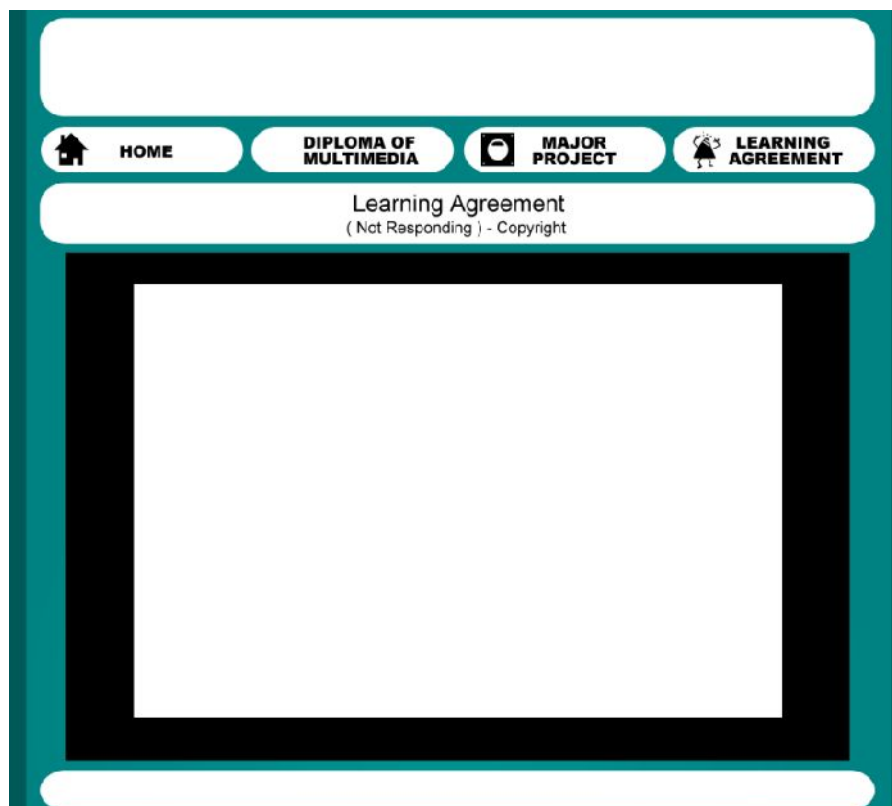
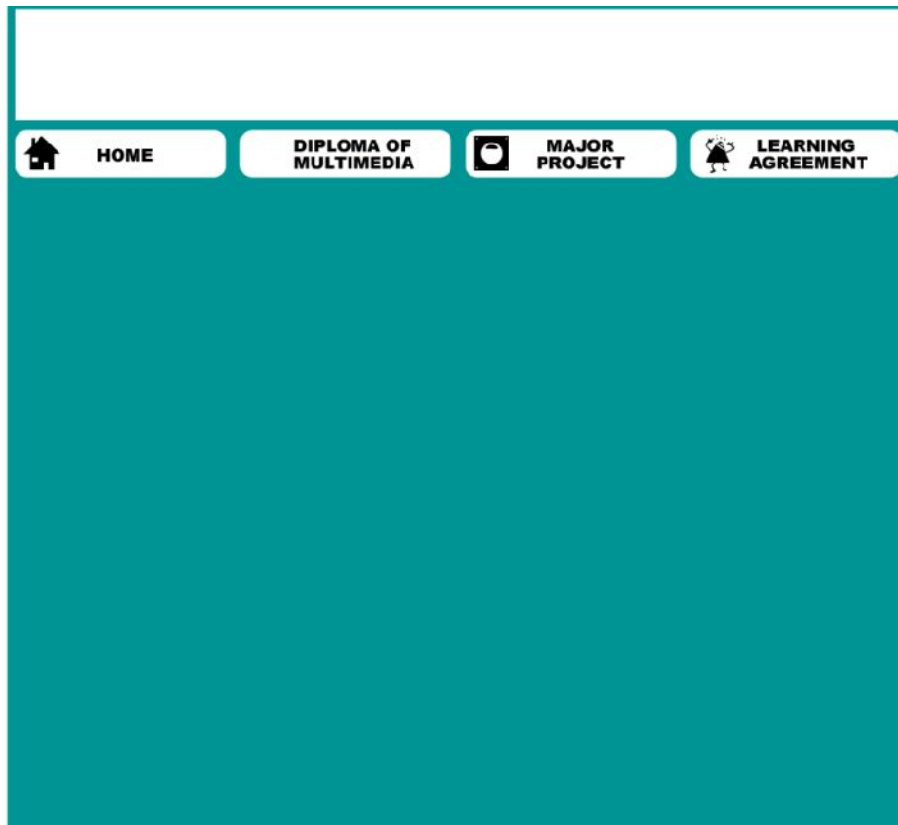

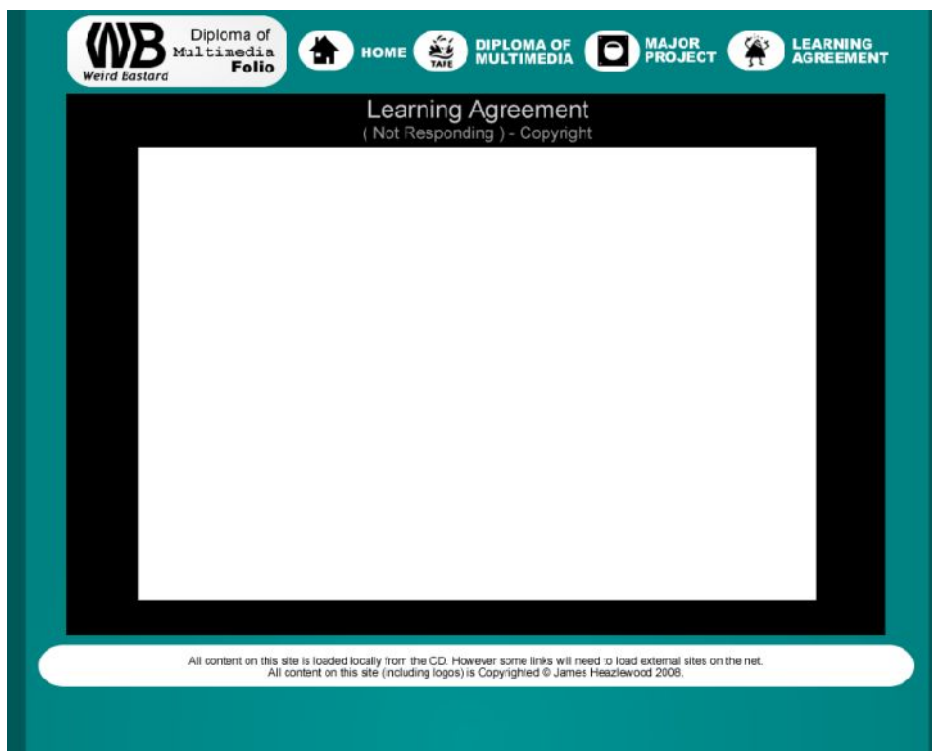
Therefore, having that soundtrack for my CD is no problem.

The site was designed originally in Fireworks. Here are the original steps of developing the site:



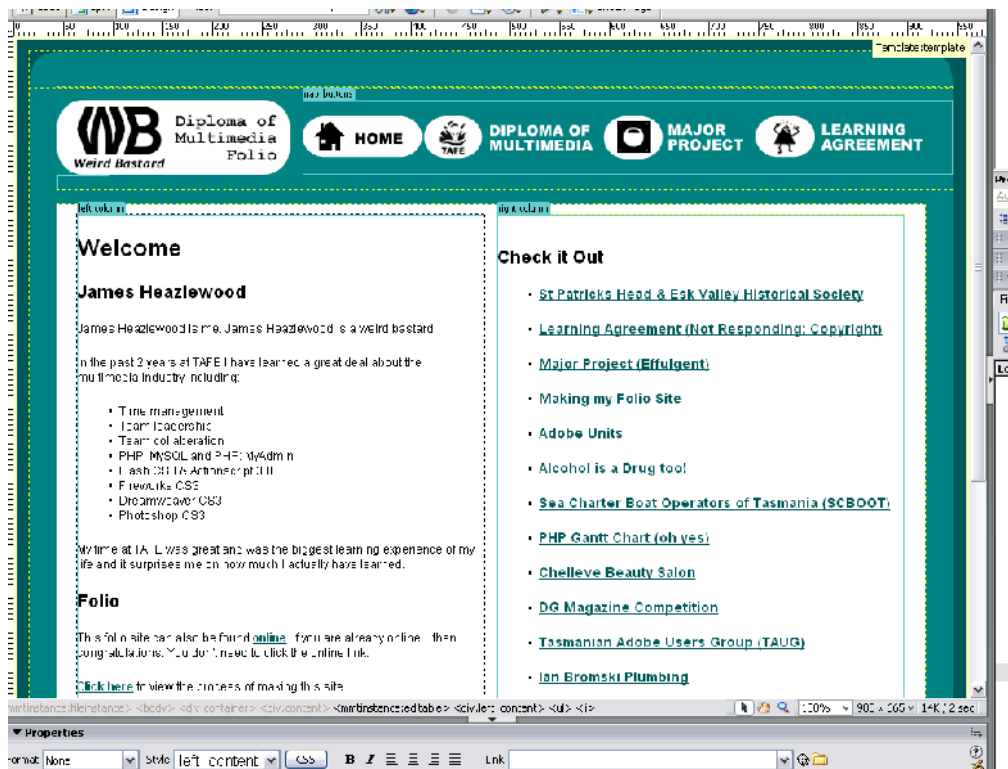




The website itself was developed from creating a single page, and using that as a template in Dreamweaver to make the rest of the pages.
